## Because what you don't know **CAN** hurt you

## Hazards are anything with the potential to harm you. And EVERY workplace has them!

- Hazards can be related to:
  - A necessary part of the workplace, like hot oil in a food truck
  - An unexpected situation, like a wind storm
  - Simple carelessness, like a cluttered workspace



## Hazards can be a result of:

- Equipment like conveyor belts, blades, mobile equipment, etc.
- Materials like glass, asbestos, toxic gases, etc.
- Processes like climbing, lifting, carrying, etc.
- People because of inexperience, lack of training, impairment, etc.
- Environment like extreme weather, excessive noise, poor lighting, etc.
- Your employer must take EVERY REASONABLE PRECAUTION to protect your health and safety. That includes:
  - Identifying all possible hazards
  - Making workers familiar with hazards and the harm they could cause
  - Establishing safe work procedures and ensuring workers follow them
- What can YOU do to protect yourself from hazards?
  - Use safety devices and follow safe work procedures
  - Wear personal protective equipment (PPE) required for the task
  - Learn about hazards of all types, and look for them everywhere
  - Refuse to do tasks which you believe might cause you harm







## **Types of Hazards**

Physical	Elements in your environment that could cause physical injury.  Examples: sun, extreme heat, extreme cold, noise, vibration, electricity, etc.
Chemical	Chemical products ingested or inhaled <b>Examples:</b> cleaners, stripping agents, pesticides, paints, finishes, glues, drugs, alcohol, etc.
Biological	Biological factors  Examples: viruses, bacteria, germs, poisonous plants, mould, etc.
Ergonomic	Tasks requiring excessive exertion or repetitive motion  Examples: heavy lifting, standing for long periods of time, awkward work stations, etc.
Safety	Conditions resulting from carelessness <b>Examples:</b> untidy work stations, water on the floor, trip hazards, impairment of workers, etc.
Psychological	Conditions that lead to psychological stress and injury <b>Examples:</b> harassment, trauma, extreme pressure and deadlines
