

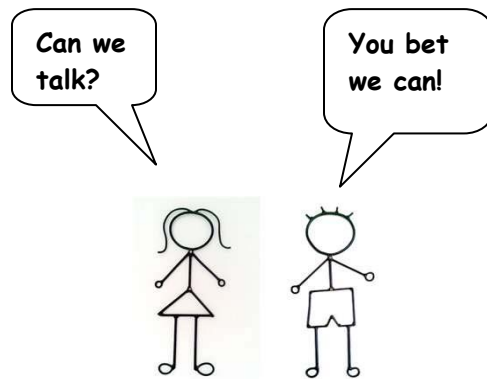
KEEPING IT SAFE IN THE WORKPLACE: YOU HAVE A ROLE TO PLAY
